

OUR APPROACH

At KIPP San Jose Collegiate, students complete a college-prep course load that exceeds the University of California A-G requirements. Each student completes 13 hours of community service annually during their 10th, 11th, and 12th grade years, and participates in after-school tutorial sessions. Our scholars attend school from 8:00 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, and Friday; from 8:00 a.m. to 2:15 p.m. Wednesday; and from 8:00 a.m. to 3:20 p.m. Thursday.

In August 2008, KIPP San Jose Collegiate opened its doors to students in East San Jose to prepare them for success in college and in life. 
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

% of 10th - 12th graders who took at least 1 AP exam % of graduating seniors who scored a 3 or higher


